Data Breach at FirstU

Yesterday, May 23, we received an email from a 'board member' asking for a PDF of the FirstU Directory. Unfortunately, this info was provided to the scammer.

How this Happened

The scammer retrieved the Board of Director's name and the general office email address from the FirstU website.

What were the tip offs:

- 1. the sending email was NOT their actual address.
- 2. The expression in the request was not indicative of this person's writing style.

Actions We are Taking

- We have removed the names and bios of the Board and placed them on the Member's Page, which is password protected.
- On the Contact Us Page, only FirstU emails for Board members are present, without names. Staff contact info remains, however:
- Staff are in the process of adding the FirstU logo and corporate colour (green) to their signatures. Staff signatures will appear at the bottom of all emails sent.
- We have already been working to remove all personal email addresses from the website and eUU. We do this by using a forwarding FirstU email address, or embedding your address in a link.


